



- More preservation/creation of natural areas

- Need for multi-use and unstructured fields








#### THEMES: INDOOR SPORTS






# **LOCATION OF SURVEY RESPONDENTS**















 Households Have a Need for a Wide Range of Outdoor Facilities






 Households Have a Need for a Wide Range of Programs and Activities




by percentage of households who have a need for programs and activities







by percentage of respondents





# SURVEY RESULTS Summary

- There Is a Need for a Wide Variety of Outdoor Facilities, Indoor Facilities, and Programs/Activities
- The Top Overall Priorities for <u>Outdoor Facilities</u> Are: Hiking Trails, Natural Areas and Wildlife Habitats, and Paved Multi-Use Trails
- The Top Overall Priorities for <u>Indoor Facilities</u> Are: Swimming Pool and Exercise and Fitness Equipment
- The Top Overall Priorities for <u>Programs and Activities</u> Are: Nature, Fitness/Wellness Programs, and Special Events/Festivals
