I found this document by the FHWA that helps quantify level of service (LOS) for shared use trails. https://www.fhwa.dot.gov/publications/research/safety/pedbike/05138/

With it, we can now:

- a) determine what LOS we currently have at different times of the day, day of the week and even seasonally
- b) decide what LOS we want to establish at the policy level as a preferred or minimum
- c) know what width is appropriate to design for the LOS we choose

You'll see on the tables in Appendix C they've even adjusted them to account for the relative dominance of different users (bicycle-heavy, pedestrian-heavy or balanced).

As you know, we have many years of counts on most of our major trails, broken out by travel mode in 15 minute increments. So figuring out current LOS for various periods of time shouldn't be very hard. After that we can start to have a conversation with the community about what LOS we should *plan* for.

Let's meet up when it works best for you to incorporate this into the POPs plan.

Hi Heather,

Thanks for reaching out and asking for clarification.

Currently, this slide splits various facilities in two categories: "Facilities with Numeric & Spatial Level of Service (LOS)" and "Facilities with Numeric LOS only". We are asking you to tell us which facilities you think would be appropriate to have both Spatial & Numeric LOS and which would need Numeric LOS only.

Numeric LOS would basically be a number of population served by a specific facility: for example, 1 dog park per 30,000 people. Numeric LOS would be based on the needs assessment and best practices.

Spatial LOS adds a spatial component, and would be appropriate for the facilities you expect to be located in a certain distance from a place of residence (we are proposing here different travel times to measure this distance, for example, a 10 minute travel time in low density areas and 5 minute travel time in high density areas for playgrounds). In this case, you would expect to get to a playground in a 5 or 10 minute walking distance (we would also add other mode of transportation where applicable, e.g., cycling, public transit, driving). Some facilities, such as nature centers, for

example, you would probably expect to have somewhere in the County but not necessarily in any specific proximity from your place of residence (in that case, we would apply only Numeric LOS and say: the County needs x number of nature centers per 100,000 people).

Everyone,

I've continued to examine the POPS data and find a message there that is being lost at the summary level that DPR presents. I know they present at that level for simplicity's sake, and that's understandable.

However, in looking at the detailed data, I noted that the percentage of respondents in older age categories was far greater than the proportion of they represent in the total county population, while the percent of respondents under the age of 35 was far lower than the total. For example, 43% of survey respondents were age 55 and older but they represent about 25% of the total county population. Therefore, their needs and interests have disproportionate effect on survey results when they are averaged across all respondents.

This is important because people aged 35-54 make up about one-third of total population, and when you add kids to their percentage, you have about half the county's total population.

When survey results are examined by age group, it turns out that people in the 35-54 year age range or people in their households (possibly their kids) consistently have a greater need for sports related facilities and programs than the survey average. Their need for nature facilities and dog parks mirrors the average, but their need for sports facilities is greater and is being overshadowed in the survey by the older age groups who not have such needs.

For example, 38% of all respondents expressed a need for rectangular fields compared to 52-58% of the 35-54 age range. 41% on average need playgrounds compared to 70% aged 35-44. 63% on average need a pool compared to 72-81% aged 35-54. 28% on average need indoor sports facilities compared to 40-45% aged 35-54.

I will build this message into my slides and I will keep hammering it in the working group but we need to talk to DPR about also getting this message out there when they talk about POPS. Understanding the true needs of half of the county's residents will help us better address their needs and avoid making costly mistakes.
